

Timeline of Questionable Events

October 9, 2023 - School board reviews Piper Sandler's report on bonding capacities (pg 4).**

December 2023 - **Sink was left on overnight in a locked room.*****

January 2024 – **Superintendent Olhausen ordered that the boiler be turned off on Saturday, January 6.*****

January 7, 2024 (Sunday) - Boiler was shut off.***

January 8, 2024 (Monday) – Rasmussen worked on boiler.**

January 9, 2024 - **Rasmussen proposal said it would take 10 business days to complete the task (pg 3).****

January 9, 2024 (Tuesday) – **Olhausen texted RSG daycare director wanting to sit down and discuss the future of the building and of the daycare.*****

January 12, 2024 – Olhausen met with Ready, Set, Grow! Learning Center director. **Olhausen asked RSG to leave by 2025.*****

January 14, 2024 (Sunday) – Rasmussen said boiler was put back together and started.**

January 15, 2024 – (Monday) 4 Seasons “shut off water and boiler to repair leaks”***

January 2024 – **Anonymous credible source saw some 3rd floor windows open a crack on top*****

January 16, 2024 – (Tuesday) 4 Seasons “installed copper piping” and got “boiler back on and working properly”.**

January 17, 2024 – (Wednesday) **4 Seasons found water valves open on 3rd floor, causing water to come out and work down to administrative offices. They shut valves and started boiler back up.****

January 17, 2024 (Wednesday 6PM) – **School board voted to approve intent to discontinue 28E with public library.***

January 30, 2024 Records request sent to Superintendent Olhausen

January 31, 2024 **Olhausen's first estimate to answer records request, \$2032.**

March 2, 2024 Asked sheriff for record of calls in December and January.

March 4, 2024 Received material from sheriff revealing several calls, but we didn't see any calls to report suspected criminal activity.**

March 11, 2024 (Monday) **School board votes to inquire bids to tear down 3 portion of Former High School***

March 11, 2024 Olhausen's report included: “The DLR group reviewed the Alta-Aurelia buildings for their assessment report. A facilities committee of fifteen to twenty community members is suggested to help determine facility needs and wants.”*

March 13, 2024 **Emailed Rasmussen's Erik Hauptman asking if they had any responsibility to reschedule the boiler work, knowing it would be cold. Also asked if they'd spoken with AACCS about possible contract work on new school buildings. Received no response.**

March 14, 2024 11:56AM Letter and supporting documents sent to Tom Hinkeldey, suggesting that he respond by calling the sheriff.

March 14, 2024 **1:13PM Tom Hinkeldey responds that our request is unreasonable.**

March 20, 2024 Emailed the rest of the board members the same letter and materials.

March 20, 2024 Tom Hinkeldey responds that “they will not be responding as I already sent you the boards response”.

March 29, 2024 Emails school board members, asking if they wish to respond any differently.

April 2, 2024 Nicole Weathers emails that she agrees with Mr. Hinkeldey. Rowher emails that he agrees with Mr. Hinkeldey.

April 30, 2024 AACFP sent “Call the Sheriff” fliers to Alta and Aurelia addresses

April 30, 2024 President Hinkeldey responds to flier, saying “We do not intend to call Sheriff Elston.”

May 13, 2024 School board meeting. Paul Dorr speaks during public comment time. After public comment time was over, and some AACFP had left, Olhausen shares response to “Call the Sheriff” flier.

May 21, 2024 For the 3rd time, Olhausen does not grant our request to allow an engineer to tour the Former High School.

June 2024 AACFP invites Alta & Aurelia citizens to Town Hall meeting at Lake Creek.
